Dear CCCTC Students and Families:


On Monday, November 23, 2020, Governor Tom Wolf, the PA Department of Health and the PA Department of Education made several new recommendations for schools in conjunction with new guidance, mandates, and an [Attestation requirement](#). This new guidance is directly related to 59 of our 67 counties experiencing [Substantial COVID-19 transmission](#). **As a result, the Crawford County Career and Technical Center will move to a 100% virtual learning environment on December 1, 2020.** The 100% virtual learning will occur through December 4, 2020, but families should prepare for a longer extension of the 100% virtual learning mode of instruction. The CCCTC will continue to work collaboratively with our sending school districts to discuss the continuation of virtual learning and our Attestation decision.

Our goal was to never transition to a 100% virtual environment. We recognize the decision to continue remote learning will impact families' lives and schedules. Our first, most important job is ensuring the health and safety of our students and staff, and the way we do that is to work closely with and listen to our health and safety experts at the local and state level. The Joint Operating Committee and staff believe in-person learning is of paramount importance for the well-being of our students and our community.

Lastly, all PA schools are required to enforce the November 20th Secretary of Health's [Travel Order](#). Students and staff visiting other states are required to have a **negative COVID-19 test within 72 hours** prior to entering the commonwealth or **quarantine for 14 days** upon return to Pennsylvania.
