CRRSAA & ARP - Student Portion Reporting

1. An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
 - a. *The Certification and Agreement, signed on 4/28/2020 was submitted via grants.gov on 4/28/2020.*

2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.
 - a. *CRRSAA funds received for student grants was \$24,927 and ARP funds received for student grants was \$59,277*
 - b. *CRRSAA funds were received in Crawford County CTC G5 account on 4/28/2021 and ARP funds were received in the Crawford County G5 account on 5/14/2021*
 - c. *CRRSAA funds were drawn from the G5 account on 4/29/2021 and ARP funds were drawn from the G5 account on 9/28/2021*

3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs as of the date of 9/30/2021.
 - a. *CRRSAA were disbursed in full (\$24,927) to students on 5/04/2021.*

ARP funds: \$25,000 disbursed to students on 9/30/2021 with remainder to be drawn down on 1/3/2022 and disbursed at that time.

4. The estimated total number of students at the institution that are eligible to receive Emergency Aid Grants to Students under CRRSSA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

- a. CRRSAA funds were divided among 13 eligible students based on need.
ARP funds first disbursement was divided among 10 eligible students.*
 - b. CRRSAA :Each student received \$1,917.50.*
 - c. ARP: Each student received \$2500.*
5. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.
 - a. CRRSAA: 13 students*
 - b. ARP: 10 students as of 10/4/2021.*
6. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.
 - a. CRRSAA: Students completed a financial need form.
ARP: The grant was divided equally among the 10 students after review of their financial aid files which indicated need.*
 - b. Students also had to meet the eligibility requirements of the grant.*

 - a. The funds must be used to cover expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to the coronavirus that have impacted a student's educational experience. Such expenses include, but are not limited to:
 - Technology related needs

 - Assistance with the purchase of food
 - Needs related to housing, rent/utilities
 - Assistance with health care and/or child care expenses
